Conservation Easement

The forest at Raven Ridge is extremely diverse, and WRLT was astounded to find almost every type of tree that grows in our area on the property. Douglas fir, western hemlock, tanoak, madrone, alder, Port Orford cedar, western red cedar, myrtle, Oregon ash, Sitka spruce and even the golden chinquapin make an appearance in this forest. The property is bordered by a several hundred acre stand of old-growth forest owned by the Bureau of Land Management which has been set aside as a Late Successional Reserve, and the forest at Raven Ridge will add to this block of old growth forest as it matures.

Donated by a local resident, this 40-acre easement of forest and wetlands, will also help to protect Frog Lake. Perched at over 2,000 feet in elevation, the lake provides habitat for waterfowl like wood ducks, bufflehead, egrets and herons and aquatic species including roughskinned newts and several species of frogs. The headwater stream on the property feeds into Indian Creek, a tributary to the Lower Rogue River that is important for salmon and steelhead.
